

# CROCHET EDGINGS & BORDERS

Add a professional finish to any project with these simple crochet borders.

BORDER	INSTRUCTIONS
<b>SINGLE CROCHET BORDER</b>	Work 1 sc into each stitch; place 3 sc in each corner. Continue around; join with sl st.
<b>SLIP STITCH EDGE</b>	Sl st evenly around the entire piece for a flat, tidy finish.
<b>CRAB STITCH (REVERSE SC)</b>	Work sc from left to right to create a twisted cord-like edging.
<b>PICOT EDGE</b>	Sc in stitch, ch 3, sl st into first ch; sc in next stitch. Repeat.
<b>SHELL EDGE</b>	5 dc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches, sc in next. Repeat around.
<b>HALF-SHELL EDGE</b>	3 dc in one stitch; skip 1–2 stitches, sc in next. Repeat.
<b>SCALLOP EDGE</b>	5 hdc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches, sl st in next stitch. Repeat.
<b>V-STITCH EDGE</b>	In each stitch, dc, ch 1, dc for a simple open border.
<b>GRANNY STRIPE BORDER</b>	3 dc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches. Repeat for classic granny look.
<b>RUFFLE EDGE</b>	Work 2–3 dc in every stitch around to create ruffles.
<b>BLOCKED / CHECKER EDGE</b>	Sc, ch 1, skip 1 stitch; repeat around for a neat, boxed finish.
<b>ZIGZAG / POINTED EDGE</b>	Across 5 stitches: sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc to form small peaks. Repeat.
