CROCHET EDGINGS & BORDERS

Add a professional finish to any project with these simple crochet borders.

BORDER	INSTRUCTIONS
SINGLE CROCHET BORDER	Work 1 sc into each stitch; place 3 sc in each corner. Continue around; join with sl st.
SLIP STITCH EDGE	Sl st evenly around the entire piece for a flat, tidy finish.
CRAB STITCH (REVERSE SC)	Work sc from left to right to create a twisted cord- like edging.
PICOT EDGE	Sc in stitch, ch 3, sl st into first ch; sc in next stitch. Repeat.
SHELL EDGE	5 dc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches, sc in next. Repeat around.
HALF-SHELL EDGE	3 dc in one stitch; skip 1–2 stitches, sc in next. Repeat.
SCALLOP EDGE	5 hdc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches, sl st in next stitch. Repeat.
V-STITCH EDGE	In each stitch, dc, ch 1, dc for a simple open border.
GRANNY STRIPE BORDER	3 dc in one stitch; skip 2 stitches. Repeat for classic granny look.
RUFFLE EDGE	Work 2–3 dc in every stitch around to create ruffles.
BLOCKED / CHECKER EDGE	Sc, ch 1, skip 1 stitch; repeat around for a neat, boxed finish.
ZIGZAG / POINTED EDGE	Across 5 stitches: sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc to form small peaks. Repeat.
