*Wraps per inch (WPI) is a simple way to measure yarn thickness when you don't know its weight category

How to do it:

- Take a ruler or pencil.
- Wrap the yarn around it without overlapping.
- Count how many wraps fit in 1 inch.
- The number tells you the yarn thickness (thin yarn = more wraps, thick yarn = fewer wraps).

Crocheting Tips

- Pull from the center to keep your yarn from rolling away.
- Match fiber to project—cotton for dishcloths, wool for warmth.
- Check dye lots if you need color consistency.
- **Swatch first**—it saves time later.
- Store skeins loosely to avoid stretching the fibers.
- Use a yarn bowl to tame slippery balls.
- Wind skeins into cakes for smoother tension.
- **Keep scrap yarn**—it's perfect for stitch markers.

• Avoid tight tension—it tires your hands and stiffens fabric.
